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# CancerX Example Solution Instructions

## EXAMPLE SOLUTION SUBMISSION TEMPLATE

### GOAL:

To highlight digital solutions that have a demonstrated impact on access to cancer treatment and/or cancer clinical trials or an impact on financial toxicity that accrues after a cancer diagnosis. Partner organizations are invited to submit an example solution that meets the criteria outlined in number 1 below to [katie.gagel@dimesociety.org](mailto:katie.gagel@dimesociety.org) for consideration. Accepted organizations will work with the CancerX team to develop the example for release in [the Solutions Catalog](#) on the [cancerx.health](http://cancerx.health) site.

### GENERAL GUIDELINES:

1. Example solutions provided by CancerX partner organizations should describe existing digital health solutions that do one or more of the following:
  - a. Improve access to cancer care
  - b. Improve access to cancer clinical trial opportunities
  - c. Reduce financial toxicity associated with a cancer diagnosis
2. The primary audience for these example solutions is health system stakeholders (health system executives, digital health divisions, clinicians etc.) who implement digital health solutions to support improved patient access to cancer care and trials as well as reduced patient financial toxicity.
3. Each example solution should be about a page in length. The final text will be inputted to a standard template with your group's logo included. Please provide this logo upon submission. We will share final versions of the example solutions with the authoring group before they are published.
4. The example solutions will be published on the [CancerX website](#) to demonstrate the impact of existing digital health tools on patient access and financial toxicity

### EXAMPLE SOLUTION TEMPLATE (PLEASE POPULATE THE BELOW TEMPLATE):

1. The Problem (describe only the issue(s) that your solution addresses)
  - a. Describe the issues that contribute to inequities in access to cancer care
  - b. Describe the issues that contribute to inequities in access to cancer clinical trials
  - c. Describe the issues that contribute to high levels of patient financial toxicity
2. The Intervention
  - a. Introduce your solution; describe core objective and components
  - b. Describe how patients, providers, and/or other stakeholders interact with the solution as part of routine cancer care
3. The Impact
  - a. Describe how your solution impacts access to cancer care
  - b. Describe how your solution impacts access to cancer clinical trials
  - c. Describe how your solution functions to reduce patient financial toxicity
  - d. Share evidence and/or data quantifying impact on these outcomes (if it exists)
  - e. Describe how solution supplements or improves traditional cancer care models
